Beginning in late September/early October, the Warren County Prosecutor's Office Narcotics Task Force in conjunction with the New Jersey State Police at Washington and the Lopatcong Township Police Department began working a prostitution investigation targeting persons and places in Warren County believed to be involved in prostitution.

On October 3, 2008, following an undercover operation, Laura Breymeier was arrested at 10 Park Street, Liberty Township, Warren County, New Jersey and charged with one count of engaging in prostitution, a disorderly persons offense. The investigation revealed that the defendant agreed to engage in a sexual act with an undercover officer in exchange for money. The defendant appeared in North Warren Municipal Court on October 9, 2008 and entered a not guilty plea. The next scheduled court date is November 13, 2008.

On October 14, 2008, following an undercover operation, Jishu Li was arrested at Studio 57 Bodyworks located at 404 Route 57, Lopatcong Township and charged with one count of engaging in prostitution, a disorderly persons offense. The investigation revealed that the defendant agreed to engage in a sexual act with an undercover officer in exchange for money. A check with Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) revealed that Ms. Li was in the country illegally. An ICE detainer was issued and Ms. Li is pending deportation proceedings as well as criminal proceedings. Defendant is scheduled to appear in Lopatcong Municipal Court on October 21, 2008.

Disorderly persons offenses carry a maximum sentence of six months in jail and a \$1,000 fine. All persons are presumed innocent until proven guilty in a court of law.
