On October 7, 2009, the Warren County Prosecutor's Office Special Victim's Unit filed complaints against Kevin J. Ebner for one count of fourth degree Sexual Contact, one count of fourth degree Aggravated Assault, and one count of Lewdness, a disorderly persons offense. A fourth degree crime carries a maximum penalty of 18 months in New Jersey State Prison and a disorderly persons offense carries a maximum penalty of six months in county jail.


The complaints allege that on or between May 1, 2009 and June 30, 2009, Kevin J. Ebner committed the crime of Aggravated Assault by pointing a firearm at or in the direction of the female victim. The female victim was known to the defendant. The crime allegedly occurred in Hackettstown, New Jersey.

The complaints further allege on or about August 29, 2009, that Kevin Ebner committed the crime of Sexual Contact against a second female by touching her intimate parts using force or coercion. The lewdness charge alleges that the defendant also exposed his genitalia to the victim. The female victim was also acquainted with the defendant. These alleged offenses occurred in Independence Township, New Jersey.

The Warren County Prosecutor's Office served the complaints on the defendant who voluntarily surrendered to authorities earlier in the day. Thereafter, the Honorable John Coyle, J.S.C. released the defendant on his own recognizance. The defendant's first appearance is scheduled for Thursday, October 8, 2009, at 1:30 P.M.

The investigation was conducted by the Warren County Prosecutor's Office. Criminal charges are merely accusations and the defendant is presumed to be innocent of all charges unless and until proven guilty.
