STATE IN THE INTEREST OF DANIEL CAPPIELLO, NATHANIEL MANN, THEODORE MANN, AND RANDY MILLER

Daniel Cappiello
DOB: 03/27/90
Age: 17
Address: Blirstown, Warren County, New Jersey

On July 10, 2007, the Honorable Ann Bartlett sentenced a juvenile, Daniel Cappiello, 17, to one (1) year deferred disposition on one (1) count of Theft, a third degree offense. As conditions of the deferred disposition, the judge ordered the following:

- (1) Tour Warren Acres,
- (2) Perform 45 hours of community service,
- (3) Obtain/maintain employment
- (4) Pay a \$30.00 Violent Crimes Compensation Board Penalty,
- (5) Pay a \$15.00 Law Enforcement Officers Training and Education Fund penalty.
- (6) Repay Parents

Cappiello plead guilty to one (1) count of Theft, a third degree offense.

The charges resulted from an investigation by the Blirstown Police Department which revealed that between March and May of 2007, Cappiello kept the currency generated from processing fraudulent returns of merchandise at Eckerd Drug Store in Blirstown, where he was employed.

The third degree offense carries a potential maximum sentence of two (2) years in the State Correctional Facility for Juveniles. If the juvenile successfully completes the terms of his deferred disposition, the charges will be dismissed.

The matter was handled by Nicole N. Lenar, Esq., on behalf of the juvenile and Dit Mosco, Assistant Prosecutor on behalf of the State.

Address: Washington Borough, Warren County, New Jersey

On July 10, 2007, the Honorable Ann R. Bartlett sentenced a juvenile, Nathaniel Mann, age 17, to one year probation on four (4) counts of burglary, a third degree offense. The judge also ordered the juvenile to:

- (1) Spend 30 days in Warren Acres Juvenile Detention Center,
- (2) Perform 30 hours of community service,
- (3) Have no contact with the co-juvenile involved in the incident,
- (4) Pay a \$120.00 Violent Crimes Compensation Board Penalty,
- (5) Pay a \$15.00 Law Enforcement Officers Training and Education Fund penalty,
- (6) Pay restitution for damages,
- (7) Provide a DNA sample,
- (8) Undergo fingerprinting,
- (9) Obtain and maintain a job; part time if in school, full time otherwise
- (10) Attend school and obey school rules

Mann plead guilty to four (4) counts of burglary. The charges resulted from an investigation by the Washington Borough Police Department which revealed that on March 11, 2007, Mann and two other juveniles entered the Washington Borough pool house through the roof, damaged the ceiling in the process, and stole numerous items. Mann also entered the residence of a neighbor on three separate occasions and unlawfully took various items, including an Apple iPod and cash.

These third degree offenses each carry a potential maximum sentence of two (2) years in the State Correctional Facility for Juveniles.

The matter was handled by Gregory Gianforcaro, Esq., on behalf of the juvenile and Dit Mosco, Assistant Prosecutor on behalf of the State.

On July 10, 2007, the Honorable Ann R. Bartlett sentenced a juvenile, Theodore Mann, age 15, to one (1) year deferred disposition on one (1) count of burglary, a third degree offense. As conditions of the deferred disposition, the judge ordered the following:

- (1) Tour Warren Acres,
- (2) Perform 30 hours of community service,
- (3) Have no contact with the co-juvenile involved in the incident,
- (4) Pay a \$30.00 Violent Crimes Compensation Board Penalty,
- (5) Pay a \$15.00 Law Enforcement Officers Training and Education Fund penalty.
- (6) Write a letter of apology to Washington Borough community,
- (7) Obtain and maintain a job; part time if in school, full time otherwise
- (8) Pay restitution to Washington Borough, and
- (9) Attend school and obey school rules

Mann plead guilty to one (1) count of burglary, a third degree offense. The charge resulted from an investigation by the Washington Borough Police Department which revealed that on March 11, 2007, Mann and two other juveniles entered the Washington Borough pool house through the roof, damaged the ceiling in the process, and stole numerous items.

The third degree offense carries a potential maximum sentence of two (2) years in the State Correctional Facility for Juveniles. If the juvenile successfully completes the terms of his deferred disposition, the charges will be dismissed.

The matter was handled by Chad Williams, Esq., on behalf of the juvenile and Dit Mosco, Assistant Prosecutor on behalf of the State.

Randy Miller

Age: 17

Address: Phillipsburg, Warren County, New Jersey

On July 10, 2007, the Honorable Ann R. Bartlett sentenced a juvenile, Randy Miller, age 17, to one (1) year probation on one (1) count of criminal mischief, a fourth degree offense. The judge also ordered the juvenile to:

- (1) Spend 15 days (suspended) in the Warren Acres Juvenile Detention Center,
- (2) Perform 30 hours of community service,
- (3) Pay a \$30.00 Violent Crimes Compensation Board Penalty,
- (4) Pay a \$15.00 Law Enforcement Officers Training and Education Fund penalty.
- (5) Restitution for damages,
- (6) Provide a DNA sample,
- (7) Undergo fingerprinting,
- (8) Undergo a mental health evaluation and comply with any recommended treatment, including anger management,
- (9) Attend school and obey school rules, of
- (10) Obtain/maintain employment and obtain a GED, and
- (11) Write a letter of apology to the people of Phillipsburg.

Miller plead guilty to one (1) count of fourth degree criminal mischief. The charge resulted from an investigation by the Phillipsburg Police Department which revealed that on April 2, 2007, Miller and two other juveniles broke out and damaged several of the spindles in the Phillipsburg gazebo.

This fourth degree offense carries a potential maximum sentence of one (1) year in the State Correctional Facility for Juveniles.

The matter was handled by Gregory Gianforcaro, Esq., on behalf of the juvenile and Dit Mosco, Assistant Prosecutor on behalf of the State.
